## **Club Organization**

### **Club Director**

Maria Hardwick will be the Club Director/Head Coach for the 2007 season. She is responsible for overseeing the entire program of all age divisions, training, development of practice and competition schedules, communicating with coaches and various entities regarding participation in tournaments, etc. Shee will be responsible for assessing all fees, collecting dues and other applicable fees, monitoring the Club's budget, paying bills. ### **Coaches**

Our coaches come from the college and club ranks. They are here because they have a genuine interest in developing all players to the best of their ability. They have been selected because of their background, proven ability and dedication. Each coach is under the supervision of the Club Director, who is responsible for the training of all PVA players.

### **Team Parent(s)**

Each team will have a Team Parent who will help organize trips and act as the team's chaperone on trips. Parents who are interested in this role should contact the Club Director.

### **Team Design**

For the 2007 season, we plan to field two 17s and one 14s team.

**PVA will carry no more then 10 members on a team.**

## **Guidelines for Coaches**

### **Practice Commitment**

Each coach is expected to make a concerted effort to make every practice and to come prepared to give his or her best effort to each and every player. Preparation includes the creation of a practice plan that incorporates the various skills and systems that will be utilized by Power Volleyball Academy. All teams will learn the same fundamental skills and systems.

### **Competition Commitment**

Unless there is a circumstance that prevents a coach from attending a tournament, the coach is expected to travel to each and every event. The philosophy of Power Volleyball Academy is players will get fair playing time. There is no such thing as “equal” playing time in volleyball. Volleyball is different from other sports in that it is not a timed game; there are no innings, no quarters or halves to base playing time. Due to the nature and speed of the game, you cannot judge “time” by rotations or points in volleyball either. We understand that all players practice so they can play in games. Our coaches will strive to give all players “fair” playing time based on practice, ability, attendance, skills, positions, situations, etc. so they may have the opportunity to display what they are learning. A coach will have the discretion to use all players in a way that will benefit the team. Ultimately, coaches will have final decision on playing time.

## **Guidelines for Players**

### **Responsibility to Teammates/Club**

You have made a commitment to be part of a team that depends on each of its members to function to the best of their ability. Being a member of a team is much different than choosing to play an individual sport, such as tennis or golf. You will be expected to attend all practices and competition events, unless circumstances beyond your control prevent you from doing so. If conflicts do arise, it is your responsibility to inform your coach as soon as possible. A player who misses numerous practices and/or tournaments may be suspended or dropped from the team, with the possibility of no refund of dues paid to date.

### **Players Code of Conduct**

Power Volleyball Academy players are required to adhere to the guidelines outlined in this manual.

### **Practice Rules**

Each team has precious little time to practice the skills necessary to develop each player to the best of their ability and to develop the team skills necessary to be successful. It is imperative you make every

effort to: (1) **BE ON TIME!** On time is 10 – 15 minutes early. (2) Make every practice, (3) Give your best effort in each drill, (4) Listen intently to direction given to you **by any PVA coach** and do your best to implement what is being taught, (5) Players are only permitted to talk with parents, prior to or after practice, not during practice and (6) Demonstrate respect for your coach(s), director, teammates, the facilities, Wes Crile staff and parents. (7) Players will assist in putting up and taking down of the nets and equipment. (8) Players demonstrating negative behavior may be removed from the drill and or practice. (9) No Jewelry is to be worn in practice or competitions. (10) There will be no walking during practice. (11) Players will be released by coaches once all equipment is put away and announcements are completed. Only the coaches may dismiss the players.

### Competition Rules

When PVA teams are scheduled to travel to tournaments, players and parents will be notified of specific meeting or departure times. It is the responsibility of each player to be on time. Failure to do so may cause a player to be left behind or suspended from play. Players will be expected to (1) give their best effort throughout competitions, (2) focus on the team's goals and needs, (3) assist with team officiating responsibilities, (4) assist in keeping our area clean, and (5) treat all tournament officials, referees, opponents and parents with respect.

### Playing Time

The philosophy of Power Volleyball Academy is players will get fair playing time. There is no such thing as “equal” playing time in volleyball. Volleyball is different from other sports in that it is not a timed game; there are no innings, no quarters or halves to base playing time. Due to the nature and speed of the game, you cannot judge “time” by rotations or points in volleyball either. We understand that all players practice so they can play in games. Our coaches will strive to give all players “fair” playing time based on practice, ability, attendance, skills, positions, situations, etc. so they may have the opportunity to display what they are learning. During a tournament coaches are constantly adjusting and evaluating lineups, considering individual match-ups with opponents, and addressing opportunities for individual growth and improvement. This means that there are a number of considerations why some players may receive more court time than others. Players (and parents) are expected to understand and accept their role as defined by the coach and concede that the collective performance of the team unit has priority. A coach will have the discretion to use all players in a way that will benefit the team. Ultimately, coaches will have final decision on playing time.

### Travel/Tournament Rules

Each team will have a designated Team Parent who will serve as the team's chaperone on trips, or who will select an appropriate person to perform this important duty. **Players will be expected to adhere to rules established by the Club for their SAFETY.** Those rules include, but are not limited to:

- Be on time for all meetings, gatherings and competition assignments. All players should arrive to tournaments by the designated time. Players arriving after this time may not be allowed to play in the first game.
- Players are expected to be at the appropriate court no later than 15 minutes prior to the next scheduled match (or the time designated by coach).
- **On the court** players are expected to be courteous and respectful to both the opponent and to the officiating crew. The only player that should address the referee during the match is the designated team captain. All players should be focused on performing to the best of their ability, knowing that, if this goal is achieved, the officials will rarely have a substantial impact on the outcome of a match. Any outwardly negative display during a match will not be tolerated, and will result in the player being removed from the game.

- During the match, players who are not on the court should stay at the team bench area, and be supportive. Team stats may be kept by players on the bench or interested parents.
- **Following a match:** Players and parents should respect the coaches' time with their players immediately before and after a match. This time is dedicated to discussing team matters, preparing for the upcoming match, or going over the just-completed match and the team's responsibilities immediately thereafter. **Parent's are asked to leave the area whenever the team is called together and wait until instructions have been given and the team has been released by the coach.**
- **End of Tournament: Coaches will release their players once all tournament commitments have been fulfilled.** Generally speaking, unless a team plays in the championship, immediately following a team's last match they will officiate the next match on that court. **No player will be released until all team responsibilities have been fulfilled, except in extreme circumstances.** Players and parents should be sure that the team area has been cleaned and that all personal belongings are collected and taken home. **PVA is not responsible for any players lost or stolen personal belongings.**
- ALL PLAYERS MUST PURCHASE A WHISTLE AND LANYARD.
- **If we stay overnight.** (Stay in the hotel room you have been assigned unless the chaperone or coach approves a change. Except for your parents, teammates, chaperone or other approved guest, no one is allowed in any player's room. Curfews will be adhered to and players will be expected to limit any activity that would interfere or take away from this purpose.)
- **NEVER go anyplace alone!** Whether that is at the hotel, playing site, etc., players are required to travel in groups of no less than two, regardless of how mundane or short any trip may be, i.e.; down to the concession area or restroom.
- If you and a teammate(s) are going anywhere---store, eat, etc.---away from the main group, **YOU** must inform both the chaperone or coach.
- As long as it does not take away from the team's plans, players are allowed to go with parents or other family members during competitions, **with the approval of the coach.**
- Players are expected to attend tournament for one purpose—to compete at their best!
- The coach will assign a player to be responsible to bring back the bag of balls from each competition. Any PVA equipment not accounted for will be the responsibility of the team players to reimburse PVA for missing equipment.
- Travel to and from practices and tournaments will be the responsibility of the individual players and their parents/guardians. We recommend players and parents arrange carpools with others from the same area. This will not only alleviate some time commitments for everyone, it will save gas as well.
- Only adults (21 years or older) are allowed to transport players to and from tournaments. When not traveling with his/her parent(s), the player will travel only with the adult who arrangements were made with. When returning from a tournament, players must return with: A) the adult who transported them to the tournament, B) His/her parent(s), with verbal notification to the coach, or C) another adult, provided arrangements are made with the coach and the adult who originally transported him/her to the event. If you will not be attending an event that your daughter is participating in, it is your responsibility to make transportation arrangements for her with another team parent. The details of this arrangement must be put in writing, signed and given to your coach prior to the team's departure.
- Many tournaments require an early morning departure time and it is extremely important that parents make sure all players get to bed at a reasonable time the night before a tournament. The importance of this cannot be overstated! The players all think that they're Superwoman and that going to bed early, especially on a Friday night, is silly, but we've witnessed tournament burn-out way too often. The early morning travel and the physical demand of playing 4-5 matches spread out through a long day take a heavy toll on those who don't get proper rest and nutrition.

## Communication with Coach/Club Director

Honest communication between a player and his/her coach is a vital component to the success of every player and team. Players are expected to listen to the directions of the coach and to follow those directions to the best of their abilities. Players should always remember that the coach is there to help them improve and should accept direction willingly. If a problem exists between a player and his/her coach, it is the responsibility of the *player* to communicate that problem to the coach calmly and respectfully. If the player is angry, the best tactic is to wait until they are calm before addressing the coach. If a player has attempted to solve the problem with the coach but is not satisfied with the result, that player may wish to enlist the help of his/her parents. Parents should check the section marked, *Parents: Communication with the Coach*, contained within this handbook for correct procedures to follow in communicating with their child's coach.

## **Uniform and Equipment**

Included in the Club dues is a fee to be used to purchase a uniform for each player that must be worn at competition events. That uniform will include a uniform shirt and a pair of spandex, a warm-up suit, knee pads, socks and a bag. Players will have the opportunity to purchase volleyball shoes. It is each player's responsibility to maintain and care for his/her uniform, and to make sure each item is packed for competitions. **Player's cannot legally compete with the team if they do not have the correct uniform.**

## **Injuries and Illness**

It is the responsibility of each player to communicate with his/her coach when he/she has an injury that may require special attention or to inform the coach when he/she is ill or not feeling capable of putting forth his/her best effort. No one on our staff wants to see anyone be foolishly harmed by playing with an injury/illness that may lead to more extensive damage. Please inform your coach of the slightest injury immediately when it happens. A first aid kit will go to all tournaments. All players are also strongly encouraged to purchase ankle braces to prevent minor and serious injuries that could prevent the player from completing their season.

## **Academics**

As good a player as you might be, you **cannot** attain/earn a college scholarship without maintaining a good grade point average. Players and parents are encouraged to inform the coach and Club Director if an academic problem is mounting so appropriate action can be taken. Our Club Recruiting Director will also share with players and their parents "Advice On Being Recruited by College Coaches," a handout concerning recruiting that includes rules, guidelines and helpful hints, along with a section on academics, including when someone should take the SAT and/or ACT test.

## **Participation in Other Sports/Activities**

Athletes who compete in Power Volleyball Academy are **NOT** required to give up other sports. There are no restrictions on outside activities/sports. But athletes who are selected to participate are expected to make a **strong commitment** to the team and their teammates, as outlined earlier in this Handbook. We hope your high school coaches and other instructors will work with you and our Club to establish a working relationship that will benefit all parties concerned. **If there is a conflict, the player is responsible to communicate with their coach.**

## **Guidelines for Parents**

### **Parents' Code of Conduct**

Parents will be expected to adhere to the policy and guidelines laid out within this handbook. Parents are encouraged to attend practices both to see what your daughter is learning, as well as to see how she interacts with her teammates and coaches. **Coaches are given complete charge of their respective team—with that in mind, parents will refrain from giving feedback/input to players or coaches during the course of practice or tournament play.** If questions arise, parents must wait until the conclusion of practice (after players have been released) to speak with the coaching staff. If a parent violates this policy, their player will face suspension and possible release from the club.

### **Communication with Coach/Club Director**

Parents should encourage their child to work problems out with his/her coach **without direct parental involvement.** The older the player, the more this applies. By encouraging children to solve their own problems, parents are helping their child grow and be independent problem solvers. Parents can assist by helping children make written notes of their problem, suggesting words or phrases to communicate their problem to the coach effectively, or role-playing the conversation. **Parents who jump right in to solve the problem for their child often make the problem worse rather than better.** Only after the player has made a reasonable attempt to solve the problem with the coach should a parent become involved. Parents should remember that coaches and parents have the same goal: the improvement of the player. **There is room for reasonable people to disagree on methods or tactics while still being in agreement on the same goal.** Approaching the coach as an ally rather than an adversary will smooth the problem solving process. Parents are asked to avoid talking to coaches about problems for a reasonable period of time to allow for a more professional dialogue. This is especially true at competitions or during practices.

Parents should recognize that discussing problems with other parents or coaches is usually counter-productive; it will probably make things worse rather than better. Approach the coach as an ally and work with him or her to improve the situation rather than gossiping or creating a confrontation.” Without wood a fire goes out; without gossip a quarrel dies down.” Proverbs 26:20

The Club Director may be able to help solve a particular problem. A player or parent is free to call on the Club Director for advice on how to solve a problem, including asking that he sit in on a meeting with all parties concerned to discuss the issue. A player or parent must have approached the coach first.

### **Insurance**

By becoming a member of Power Volleyball Academy and paying all registration fees, each player obtains a supplemental insurance policy through AAU that covers injuries incurred at practice and competitions, and travel to and from practices and competitions. **This is only supplemental insurance.** Your family’s insurance policy is still the primary. The supplemental insurance covers costs not covered by your insurance carrier. Each coach will have forms that must be timely filled out if an injury occurs at a practice or competition.

## **Financial Obligation**

### **Dues**

Power Volleyball Academy is a non-profit organization that is self-funded and dedicated to promoting the sport of volleyball in the Southwest Volusia County and surrounding areas. We are recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)3 tax-exempt entity as an affiliated organization under the Amateur Athletic Union of the U.S. Inc.'s group determination ruling.

The Club's members must pay all business expenses associated with providing the Club for its players. Our dues are determined by dividing the following fees between all participants: gym rental; coaches fees; AAU registration; volleyball equipment (including balls, carts, nets, etc.), insurance for players and coaches, and administrative costs (postage, printing, copying, bank charges, post office box, phone, etc.), plus each player's officiating clinic and each player's uniform cost. Players are expected to pay all dues costs according to the outlined schedule. ***Checks should be made out to "Power Volleyball Academy,"*** If you have any questions regarding charges or if you need to make special payment arrangements, it is **YOUR RESPONSIBILITY** to contact the Club Director immediately. Players that fail to meet their financial obligation in a timely manner and do not communicate any problems with meeting that obligation may face disciplinary action, including suspension.

#### **PAYMENT SCHEDULE**

**PAYMENT SCHEDULE:** The payment schedule below is intended to ease any financial strain associated with paying your club fee. We will almost always work with families who need to make special arrangements; however, it is your responsibility to communicate your need to us early. If a player falls too far behind with their payments, it is possible that they may be restricted from participating until fees are brought up to date. Please communicate with the Club Director when you are having difficulty. Players will forfeit playing and practice time if the payment is not received on time.

*\*\*Any additional fees will be discussed per team with parents and players during the season for any additional events, hotel, food, shoes, etc. Fundraising opportunities are available and also sponsorship opportunities are available for players that may need assistance.*

## Fundraising Opportunities

For those needing assistance with club dues fundraising opportunities are available through sponsorships and other avenues. Please contact the Club Director for other opportunities.

### Refund Policy

Because dues costs are determined at the beginning of the season and based on the total number of participants, refunds of dues costs will only be forthcoming in situations deemed reasonable by the Club Director. ***ALL REFUND REQUESTS MUST BE MADE IN WRITING.***

### End of Season AAU Nationals' Tournament

If a PVA team enters the AAU National Championship June 12 – 20<sup>th</sup>, this will be held in Orlando. Each player on that team will be expected to participate. The various costs associated with this tournament are over and above the regular club fees.

Other options to add in or use

#### Expectations/Requirements

**Within the Power Volleyball Academy, there are expectations of each player and of each team that need to be met in order to be successful as a team.**

**These 'rules' are in place for several reasons.**

**First, to promote unity... a winning team should be made up of players who are thinking the same way about the game. Six players on the court, all knowing what each other will do.**

**Secondly... is equality. No player, especially based upon ability or skill level, should be treated differently on the court. Each of us has abilities we have been given. The goal is to develop the skills to maximize those abilities and to make us the best players we can be so that we can blend them with other players to make us the best team we can be.**

**Lastly, to represent the PVA name honorably. When others from outside the Club, think or speak about PVA, it should be a positive reference. It is the responsibility of each player to promote that attitude to the community.**

**Toward these ends, each member of PVA must comply with the following rules:**

- 1. Players on PVA teams must attend weekly practice.** If a player misses practice, informs the coach 'well in advance' **AND** the coach feels the reason is justified, the player must sit out the first match of his/her next tournament. If a player misses practice without meeting the above criteria, the player must sit out the next tournament all-together. The player **MUST** attend the entire tournament though, suited to play.

2. **PVA members must not drink alcohol nor take any illegal substances.** Any player doing so shall be immediately lose their membership status and be expelled from PVA.
3. **PVA members must treat fellow players, coaches, and staff with appropriate respect.** Coaches may at will, insist that any player leave a practice or tournament if he/she feels it is in the best interest of the team or the Club.
4. **During competitions, PVA team players must make every effort to refrain from receiving any ‘cards’ or ‘sanctions’.** Should a player receive a sanction from a referee or official, the player will be required to take certain steps prior to being allowed to continue with the team.
5. **PVA members must remain in ‘good financial standing’ within the Club.** This can be a sensitive area for some players. Refer to the section on finance for specifics and options. A payment schedule can be arranged with the club director.
6. **Players on all PVA teams are required to arrive prior to scheduled start time of practices and tournaments.** For practices, ALL players need to be already warmed up and ready to begin rigorous physical activity by the time the scheduled ‘court time’ begins. For tournaments, although ‘team breakfasts’ are not mandated, they are STRONGLY encouraged. This begins the day on a bonded, unified note. In any case, all players are required to be in the gym at least 15 minutes prior to the scheduled time for the first match to begin. Failure to meet either of these requirements will result in the player not being allowed to play in the first match.

### **STANDARDS OF BEHAVIOR**

The following standards of behavior apply to all club representatives, players, coaches, parents and guardians.

- Use of profanity in the presence of team members, at practices, tournaments of club functions is prohibited.
- Negative propaganda, participation in negative or hurtful gossip and slandering of others is prohibited.
- Positive reinforcement and enthusiasm is encouraged. Be mindful to cheer your team’s success, not the other teams failure.
- Jeering the opposition or officials is prohibited.
- Do not distract your child’s attention during matches, practice or coaching instruction.
- At no time are parents/guardians allowed to approach officials, judges, or the scoring table during match play. Do not attempt to question officials and judges regarding calls that occurred during matches. Direct any such questions toward PVA representatives.
- Sportsmanship will be demonstrated and stressed regardless of match and tournament outcomes.
- Each player must be accompanied by an adult in charge, parent or guardian at every tournament, overnight trip or club activity.
- Observation of facility rules and policies will be respected and adhered to at all venues and establishments attended by PVA.
- Any damages caused will be the responsibility of the member’s parent or guardian
- All parents and players are expected to participate in cleaning up after tournaments and practices as appropriate.
- No member of a team will be dismissed from a tournament until all team commitments are fulfilled and completed at the discretion of the coach or club officials.
- All parents and guardians are required to insure that each member is of appropriate health and condition to participate in physical activity associated with volleyball.
- Tardiness and absences from practices are subject to physical activity as discipline assigned by coaches to players. Many coaches will excuse players if prior arrangements and notification are made. A pattern of missed practices may result in reduced playing time at tournaments.

- Conduct deemed detrimental to the club is prohibited.
- All complaints and concerns regarding playing time, positions, and things of a team nature should be made first to the team coach, and then, if still not satisfied, to the club director. A coach should never be approached during a practice or match with such concerns and never in front of a team member. If feelings are running high allow sufficient time for all parties to cool down before addressing a controversial subject. Always remain respectful, even in disagreement, with all players, parents, guardians, coaches and personnel affiliated with Power Volleyball Academy.
- Failure to abide by these standards of behavior or with the player code of conduct may result in disciplinary action at the discretion of the Club Director. Disciplinary action can include, but is not limited to, verbal and written warnings, suspensions from club participation and expulsion from the club.
- All decisions will be made in the best interest of the Club, the team and the individual player.
